OSA Open Society Archivum

Awarded a **Pulitzer Prize** for press history, the **Vera & Donald Blinken** Open Society Archivum in Budapest is one of the world's most important **Cold War research** facilities, housing the equivalent of over

100 football pitches of paper records and nearly 3,000 DVDs worth of digital records. It includes an extensive archive of **Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty** transcripts along with a growing collection of documents and audio-visual materials on international human rights and war crimes. Students in Vienna can use the archive materials, many of which are online, from Vienna via remote access.

Immerse yourself in the groundbreaking Romani Studies Program (RSP) at CEU, where you'll join scholars, policy makers, and activists in exploring Roma identity, combating anti-Roma racism, policy making, structural identity and advancing social justice.

Engage in critical debates on gender politics and structural inequality. Our RSP features two core programs: the Roma Graduate Preparation Program and the Advanced Certificate in Romani Studies.

Invisible University

In response to the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, CEU launched the Invisible University for Ukraine (IUFU) to support Ukrainian students whose education was disrupted by the war. Whether in Ukraine or having found shelter abroad, the IUFU offers a hybrid non-degree academic certificate program designed for Ukrainian bachelor's, master's and doctoral students, integrating their unique learning trajectories into a transnational comparative context.

In partnership with Ukrainian and German institutions and by engaging hundreds of world-renowned scholars, IUFU complements and supports existing educational programs in Ukraine by bridging gaps caused by the war. So far, over 1,800 students have participated in online courses, as well as residential winter and summer schools in Budapest and Lviv. This award-winning program, free of charge, also provides a platform for student voices through the Visible Ukraine online journal (visibleukraine.org). Constantly evolving around the student needs, IUFU has integrated cohorts of students and senior scholars from Belarus and Western Balkans and has expanded to an Invisible Graduate School in 2025.


